Audra Dial (2023 Lacrosse), Jade Chi (2024 Lacrosse), Kaylie Whidden (2024 Softball) and Amanda Stevens (2025 Lacrosse) were each individually elected to the NAAC, giving Valor Christian four positions on the council, the most from any single school in one year!

Three of the four have already committed to continuing their athletic careers at the next level: Audra Dial, committed to D1 Kent State, Jade Chi has verbally committed to D1 Kennesaw State and Kaylie Whidden, currently playing for Nebraska Gold, has committed to join the softball team at Division 1 University of Wisconsin. Sophomore Amanda Stevens currently plays for M&D Black 2025 out of Maryland and will likely have several choices for her collegiate experience.

Election to the NAAC is the highest sport psychology honor available to high school athletes. Nomination to the NAAC is open to athletes from all sports across all 50-states and is based on a level of excellence in Athletics, Academics and Personal Character. Once nominated, Athletes must apply for consideration, complete an interview process and if moved through to the final round, identifying information is removed from applications, then voted on by a team comprised of collegiate/high school athletic directors, collegiate/professional athletes and coaches, executive coaches, sport psychology coaches and other leadership professionals.

“The council wasn’t torn at all when we realized we had elected four athletes from the same school. We knew they were the right choices, and each brought her own unique experience.” said Catch23 Performance owner, Kaci Allen.

Lacrosse Head Coach, Terry Ellis, was drafted by the Denver Outlaws, and played on the Major League Lacrosse championship team, after competing at Division 1 University of Denver. Coach Libby Noeth played softball at Wheaton and immediately dove into coaching, now the head softball coach for the Eagles.
